

## **Prefixes and suffixes**

#### **Prefixes:**

are a group of letters that come at the beginning of a word and they change its meaning: example: happy / unhappy war / postwar

### **Suffixes:**

are a group of letters that come at the end of a word and they change its category (verb - noun - adjective - adverb....): example: child / childish comfort / comfortable lazy /lazily

- generally speaking there are three types of suffixes :
  - Verb suffixes

are suffixes added to **adjectives** or **nouns** to make **verbs** . dark (adjective) => darken centre (noun) => centralize

#### Noun suffixes

are suffixes added to **verbs**, **adjectives**, or **nouns** to make **nouns**. manage (verb) => management serious ( adjective) => seriousness friend (noun) => friendship

## o <u>adjectival suffixes</u>

are suffixes added to nouns, adjectives, or verbs to make adjectives. beauty (noun) => beautiful economic (adjective) => economical excite (verb) => excited NOTE: a word without any prefix or suffix is called **the root**
